TRAFFIC STOP LEADS TO ARREST FOR ILLEGAL GUN, DRUGS, AND MONEY

ELLETTSVILLE, INDIANA (March 4, 2019): On the night of Saturday, March 2nd, Deputy Marshal Joshua Kreigh of the Ellettsville Police Department was conducting aggressive driving patrol on the I-69 corridor as part of the Operation Pullover Grant, when he stopped a car that radar indicated was traveling 74 MPH in a 55 MPH zone. During the traffic stop, Deputy Marshal Kreigh discovered a loaded 9 mm handgun, 300 rounds of 9 mm ammunition, digital weighing scales, clear baggies, individually packaged methamphetamine packets, a packet of heroin, along with \$2,622 in United States currency.

The driver of the vehicle was identified as Charles Dustin Leon Wiley, age 29, of Spencer, Indiana, who was driving on suspended driver's license. Wiley was arrested and charged with a Level 4 Felony for Possession of Methamphetamine, Dealing while armed with a handgun, Class C Misdemeanor Possession of Paraphernalia, and Class A Misdemeanor Carrying a Handgun without a License. The passenger, identified as Cody Allen Hobbs, age 32, of Bloomington was arrested and charged with Level 5 Felony Possession of Methamphetamine, Dealing, Level 6 Felony Possession of a Narcotic Drug and Class C misdemeanor Possession of Paraphernalia.

Both Wiley and Hobbs were remanded into the custody of the Monroe County Correctional Center.

Assisting Deputy Marshal Kreigh was Deputy Marshal Mark Freeman and the Monroe County Sheriff's Office.
